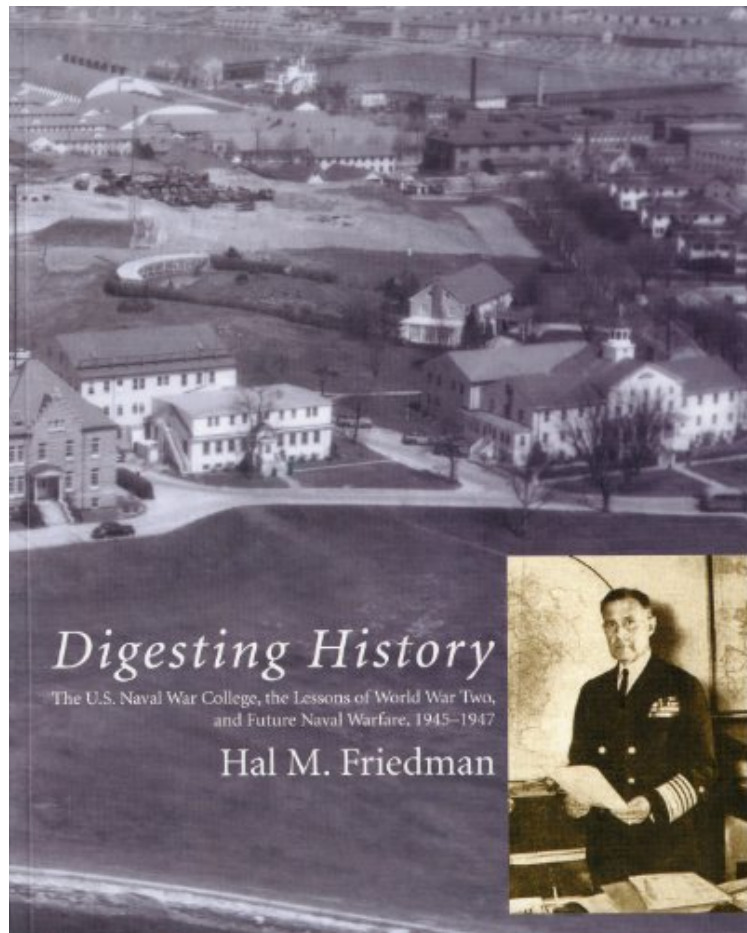

While seminal studies exist of the College's work in the interwar years, none have been published on this period.
