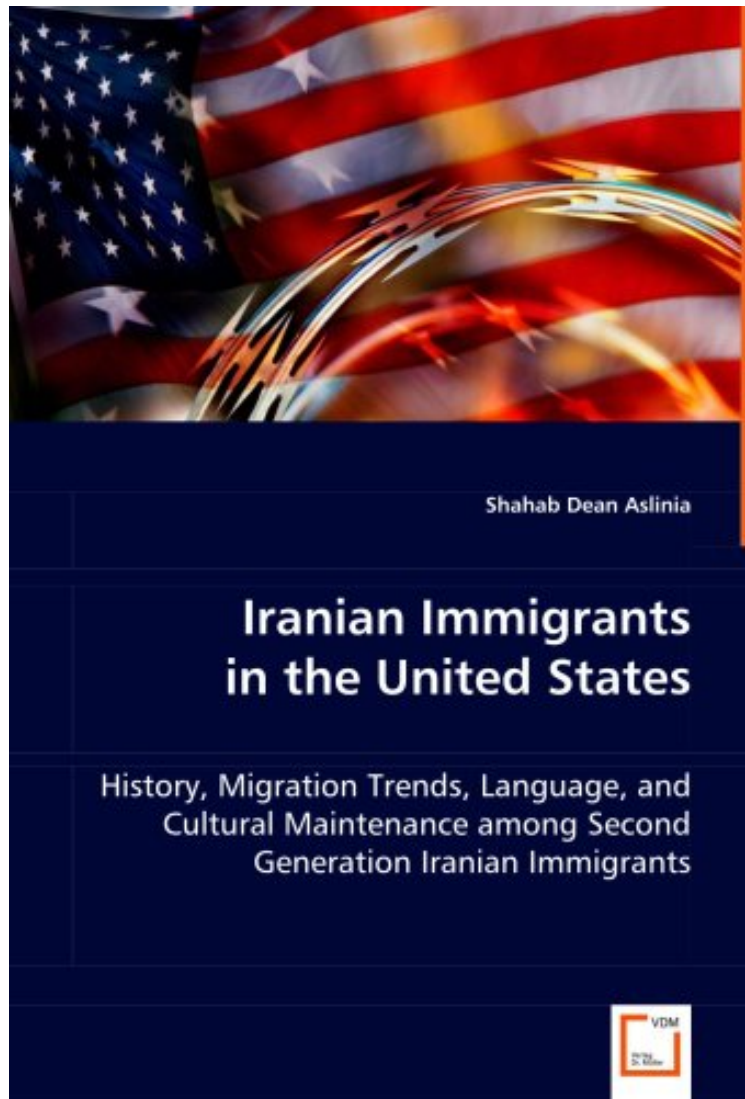


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Trends, Language, and Cultural Maintenance among Second Generation Iranian Immigrants:
